

**PROCEEDINGS OF THE COCHISE COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS
REGULAR BOARD MEETING HELD ON
TUESDAY, OCTOBER 25, 2011**

A regular board meeting of the Cochise County Board of Supervisors was held on Tuesday, October 25, 2011 at 10:00 a.m. in the Board of Supervisors' Hearing Room, 1415 Melody Lane, Building G, Bisbee, Arizona. In attendance were Patrick Call, Chair; Ann English, Vice-Chairman; Richard Searle, Supervisor; Michael Ortega, County Administrator; James E. Vlahovich, Deputy County Administrator; Britt W. Hanson, Chief Civil Deputy County Attorney; and Katie Howard, Clerk of the Board.

Chairman Call called the meeting to order at 10:09 a.m.

8. Approve Contract Number 2012-AL-012 between the Governor's Office of Highway Safety and the Sheriff's Office for a term of October 1, 2011 through September 30, 2012 providing \$10,000 to fund overtime and Employee Related Expenses for deputies to conduct enhanced DUI enforcement throughout Cochise County.

9. Approve Contract number 2012-PT-010 between the Governor's Office of Highway Safety and the Sheriff's Office for the term of October 1, 2011 through September 30, 2012 providing \$5,000 in overtime and employee related expenses for the Sheriff's Office to conduct enhanced Speed/Selective Traffic Enforcement throughout Cochise County.

Vice-Chairman English made a motion to approve items 1 through 11 of the Consent Agenda. Supervisor Searle seconded the motion and it carried unanimously.

PUBLIC HEARINGS

Board of Supervisors

12. Adopt Zoning Ordinance 11-13 to approve Docket Z-11-06 that will amend certain zoning district boundaries in the vicinity of Benson, AZ, pursuant to the application of Easter Mountain, LLC, for parcel #124-01-013H from RU-4 to SR-2, subject to certain conditions as recommended by the Planning & Zoning Commission and further recommended amendments by staff.

Ms. Beverly Wilson, Interim Planning Manager, presented this item using a PowerPoint presentation. Ms. Wilson announced the item and showed a concept map of the location at MJ-6 / Mescal I-10 interchange. She showed a location map, with the proposed development area at the end of J-6 Road. She displayed a second map showing the protests and support received: owners of 9,900 acres wrote in support; approximately 25 letters of support. 725 acres represented by people who protest; with 196 Cochise County residents who have protested and an additional 115 Pima County residents opposing, who are not shown on this map. She reviewed the public comments and reasons received both in support and protesting the proposal. She reviewed water issues and concerns, adding that the applicant is estimating usage at .33 acre feet per year. She pointed out that the calculated water usage does not include the estimated benefits of proposed water recharge and conservation. She stated that Empirita Water Company has an assured water supply of 427 acre-feet per year. She then reviewed issues regarding access to the national forest, which was a major element in the Planning & Zoning Commission's denial in 2007. Finally, she stated that the National Forest Service and the Arizona Game and Fish Department (AZGFD) have proposed an alternate access road in the 50' buffer zone. In addition, several letters from organizations throughout southeastern Arizona, requesting access to public lands through development and staff agrees that such access (both vehicular and pedestrian) should be accommodated.

The Staff recommendation is for conditional approval, as voted on in August by a vote of 5-1 at the Planning & Zoning Commission meeting. She reviewed the factors in favor of support and in favor of denial. The Planning & Zoning Commission's recommendation for approval is with four conditions: The first two are standard conditions; the third is a staff-generated condition that the applicant will submit a subdivision plat within one year and the fourth is that applicant will work with the various federal and state agencies to develop a public access through the parcel to public lands. Ms. Wilson then reviewed staff's recommendations for amendments to Conditions Numbered 3 and 4 and an

additional fifth condition which was suggested by the applicant with staff's concurrence—that the CC&Rs and the sustainability plan will be attached as an Exhibit and will be recorded with the final plat.

Chairman Call asked the Board if they had any questions of Ms. Wilson. Vice-Chairman English asked if there was access to the forest service now and Ms. Wilson stated that there is a locked gate on adjacent parcel, but no access via current subject area.

Chairman Call asked if the applicant is okay with the amended conditions suggested by staff (Numbers 3 and 4). Ms. Wilson stated that she had not discussed them with the applicant, but they are present at the meeting.

Chairman Call then invited the applicant to make their presentation to the Board. Steve Lennihan addressed the Board on behalf of the applicant. He introduced others on the team representing the applicant. One of the key things is that when property was first purchased, the idea was to keep it as much as possible "as is"—to preserve the pristine wildlife of the area and to preserve the historic value of the ranch house, and make it into a museum. He stated they have been working on the re-zoning for over five years. One of the first things we did was engage a biologist to look at the property and make recommendations for preservation. He said they met many times with neighborhood groups, the Southeast Arizona Economic Development group, the Chamber of Commerce, County staff and individual neighbors closest to the project. He pointed out that all neighbors adjacent to the project support it. Incorporated and the vast majority of those within one mile of the project support it. They have incorporated the comments into the Master Plan, the CC&Rs, the sustainability plan and in design guidelines.

The project entails 371 lots on 556 acres with not less than 50% open space. The plan is to have 1.25 acres per lot on the northern side of the project, with perimeter lots at 1 home per 2 acres. Their neighbor is the Forest Service and the developer has agreed to provide an easement and trailhead parking for pedestrian and equestrian (non-motorized) access to public lands on the western boundary of the property. He pointed out that there has never been access across this property to the forest by the public before. Water to the subdivision will be provided by Empirita Water Company which has a 427-acre feet water adequacy and the developers have approvals from both Arizona Corporation Commission and the Arizona Department of Water Resources (ADWR).

Mike Grassinger, with the Planning Center, then addressed the Board. He said it has been a team effort to develop the Master Plan and the sustainability plan. He outlined the components and said they believe that this is a unique piece of property; effort is to retain compatibility with nature and focus on sustainability. Open space (50% of land) and pedestrian circulation are very important to the plan—25% only will be devoted to lots being developed. Water resources have been of particular interest—there will be no wells on site. The focus is on water harvesting, reuse and recharge/conservation; native plants with low water use only. An element of the plan ensures guarding dark skies and focused on low voltage. Solar use is planned for properties with photo-voltaic units on homes. Buildings will incorporate energy efficient features. He pointed out that this is not a static plan—will continue to be reviewed to take advantage of new technologies. Economic development portion of sustainability: each home will have opportunity for "work at home" capabilities with internet access/electronic media—it is a short distance from University of Arizona's southern campus.

Mark Cross, the hydro-geologist on the team from Montgomery & Associates addressed the Board, explaining that they were retained to review the previous hydrologic studies. He said they looked at the foundation for analyses regarding physical availability for 100 years and that ADWR issued a designation for 471 acre feet per year—twice the estimated usage after full build-out. He then showed a slide with the well impact analysis in the Empirita Water Company service area. An impact analysis is not required outside of the area, but was performed by Empirita anyway, to determine the impact on other local area wells. He explained that if there was more than 10' of drawdown after five years of pumping, that would be considered significant and they would not be allowed to drill a well. He said the impact was less than that. He explained that the area on the map showing hydrologic bedrock is generally assumed to be less permeable than a sand and gravel aquifer. He added that there are three private wells in that area and showed the locations.

Mr. Lennihan then stated that they received protests from the Planning & Zoning staff after the Planning & Zoning Commission hearing. The developers compiled a matrix of those concerns: 40% were water concerns, 34% were traffic concerns and 22% were density concerns. One-third of the letters did not list a reason. Water issues have been addressed. Regarding traffic concerns, a Traffic Impact Analysis was conducted in 2007: at full build out (which has not yet occurred), J-6 Ranch Road would be at 75% capacity. He pointed out that 19 of the density concerns came from J-6 Ranchettes, where the average lot size is smaller than the average proposed lot size for this development.

He then reviewed the reasons to support the proposed development and added that, if approved, will donate land for access to forest. Their project, he said, meets 11 of the 12 criteria for approval, established by the Planning & Zoning Commission.

Supervisor Searle asked regarding the water mitigation plan and for specifics regarding how they propose to keep water usage down. Mr. Lennihan said details are included in the sustainability plan and reviewed the highlights: require that there will be water retention on-site, plan includes both collection and recharge, on the lots and elsewhere; require residents to minimize water use through drip irrigation with timers; encourage use of grey water. The plan includes a community pool to allow pool use and prevent individual pools.

Vice-Chairman English asked where they are proposing to provide public access and where the Forest Service wants the access. Mr. Lennihan showed both on the map, explaining that where the Forest Service wants to place the road would destroy the natural wash on the eastern boundary and pointed out that homeowners already exist along the eastern side. Developers are proposing access on western boundary; there are no homes on that line within one mile. He explained that obtaining access from state land would be required and in his experience, getting that has been very good—however, the Forest Service says their experience has not been good. The plan would require access via J6 Ranch Road and a new road across state land.

Chairman Call announced that Ms. Mary McCool had a presentation that would involve six people and represented approximately ten others. Others in this group included Dorothy Everett, Marilyn Louise Fox, Gray Gordon, Marleen Jensen and Barbara Toland—all are members of the J-6 Mescal Community Development Organization.

Chairman Call opened the public hearing. The following persons addressed the Board regarding the proposed Zoning Ordinance: George McKay (who indicated it is the Forest Service policy not to take positions regarding rezoning but who commented that the Forest Service has attempted unsuccessfully since the 1980's to negotiate legal public access for the area), Duane Bennett (officially representing the Forest Service and arguing for vehicular access), Edward Soyring and Larry Martinez—both opposed. The following persons provided comments to the Board, but expressed a neutral position on the Zoning Ordinance: Brad Fulk and Mathew Walton. The following persons addressed the Board in favor of the proposed Zoning Ordinance: Ernest Graves, James Vermilyea, Howard Myers, Mahlon MacKenzie, John Soper, Laurie Becker and Thomas Fischer. The following persons were present but did not wish to address the Board; all indicated they were opposed to the proposed Zoning Ordinance. Chairman Call read their names into the record: Catherine Neuber, Lanna Kauffman, Olga Thompson, Floyd Judah, Jr., Catherine Omann, Emma Elliott and William Omann.

Speakers stressed the importance of public input in the process and submitted additional petitions, resulting in a total of 305 parcels in opposition to the proposal versus the nine owners in favor. They stated that they all recognize the complexity of the decision before the Board and said they provided staff a packet of information several weeks ago which they wanted to make sure the Board was aware of. They recapped the history of development in the area and stressed their concerns to maintain the rural lifestyle, open space and low density growth. They expressed concerns regarding the developer's calculations of water adequacy and the impact to local area wells, as well as traffic impacts.

Brad Fulk, representing the AZGFD stated that he was neutral on the development but had concerns about Condition Number 4. He said AZGFD has offered to Eastern Mountain to purchase a six-acre portion and to construct, maintain and provide signage along road. He added that what is proposed by Eastern Mountain for public access does not meet the Planning & Zoning requirements for unrestricted public access.

No one else wished to address the Board and Chairman Call closed the public hearing.

Chairman Call asked Mr. Lennihan to respond to the information regarding the AZGFD offer. Mr. Lennihan said that the first meeting with the AZGFD occurred in 2007, during which they were concentrating on vehicular access and the developer was concentrating on non-vehicular access. The next meeting occurred in mid-September. Although that was a good meeting, he said, the biggest problem is that Forest Service wants vehicular access in a specific location, along length of the major wash at entrance to property. The developer does not want that the noise and traffic problems associated with quads and motorcycles at a location with pedestrians and horses. He pointed out that they have always supported pedestrian and equestrian access but do not support vehicular access, and particularly at the entrance to the property.

Mr. Lennihan emphasized that they do have an ADWR water designation for 427 acre feet (not the 321 acre feet mentioned by those objecting), per the water impact analysis using a model that was approved by ADWR. He also pointed out that the water usage restrictions have been tightened up since the Planning & Zoning Commission meeting. The density also is at allowable levels under the current Comprehensive Plan. Finally, he also discussed the access to the forest at the northern end near J-6, near the Empirita interchange. He said that allows access to

fifteen persons per day, via an allowance from Pima County. He said they met with the AZGFD and with the Forest Service to introduce them to a rancher who would provide access via the north end of the Whetstones, but that what those agencies are looking for is something that is not amenable to the developer. The zoning condition does not give any incentive to the Forest Service to be willing to negotiate.

Supervisor Searle asked Planning staff regarding Condition Number 5: What the condition involves and whether enforcement is available. Ms. Wilson said that the language in the Sustainability Plan has been previously approved by the Board with other zonings, specifically the Babocomari.

Vice-Chairman English asked how much needs to be done now, and how much at development. Ms. Wilson said the Board can impose any conditions it wishes to at the subdivision level and that the conditions are more restrictive at subdivision plat. This was disputed.

Mr. Hanson clarified that the Board can only impose conditions that are not requirements per the Zoning Regulations at the time of the rezoning process, not at the subdivision plat approval.

Ms. Wilson gave the Board a copy of the Sustainability Plan, explaining that Planning & Zoning had only recently received it.

The Board recessed at 12:21 p.m.

The Board reconvened at 12:35 p.m. and Ms. Wilson reviewed the Sustainability Plan Water Resources provisions, including the recent changes.

Supervisor Searle said the main thing he had wanted to clarify were the provisions for water resources and the changes made.

Vice-Chairman asked why provisions would include language like "encourage", rather than "require".

Mr. Lennihan explained the design guidelines included the requirements, but that unproven technology is not "required", but rather is "encouraged".

Vice-Chairman English asked Brad Fulk from the AZGFD to ask him if the state government had the authority to condemn property in order to gain access to the forest. Mr. Fulk stated that the Forest Service could, but that they have not done that in 45 years. To be good neighbors, they have offered to pay to get access. He said he asked the Board to consider supporting Condition Number 4 as it was approved by the Planning & Zoning Commission at the August meeting.

Supervisor Searle stated that a majority of his constituents in attendance today would like to see him vote against this. Doing so would not allow us to work on access issues. Water conservation efforts are not required. It would be a traffic impact to add 186 homes to areas. The design could be beneficial; however, he is concerned with the density proposed. Density bonus is allowed as long as open space is preserved. He stated that he is in a position where he does not like either option today. The Board has been getting letters from all over the county asking for access. He believes in property owner's rights but also knows we have a developer asking for a rezoning, asking for additional rights to put more houses in there. Granting a density bonus is not a requirement.

Vice-Chairman English asked if any of the property owners in this area have any water restrictions on water use from a private well.

Ms. Mary McCool responded that they do not. Ms. English then asked how many people out there are on a water company. Ms. McCool responded that those residing in the Mescal subdivision and in Red Hawk are on a water company, others are on private wells.

Ms. English observed that four acres lots in a subdivision are not really 'rural'. People have accessed the forest via trespass on private lands; property owners have restricted because folks have abused the privilege. She said she is not sure she agrees that to add access at the beginning of the road, entering the subdivision, is the best place. She met with the developer regarding access after the Planning & Zoning Commission meeting. People want to drive in and he told me they could provide that; now they do not want to provide that access. Pima Co is allowing access (15 per day). She had been told there was no access, but that is not the case. If you cannot buy the property next to you, you cannot control it. The Sustainability Plan should be part of our subdivision process, not a part of our zoning process. She added that the only place developers are putting the open areas in Conservation Subdivisions is where they could not develop anyway, therefore, she does not know that she will be approving the density bonus.

Chairman Call commented that there is no outcry against the development, but an outcry against the density. He added that the developer has offered access and a parking lot to the forest. He said he has always been a proponent of planned development and this is a great example of development. The water issues have been mitigated. On the whole, he said he is supportive of the developer's plans and offer of access.

Mr. Hanson advised the Board that the way that Condition Number 4 was worded, as passed by the Planning & Zoning Commission, was unworkable. He explained that the way the condition was worded did not provide a way for staff to determine if the condition had been complied with. He reviewed staff recommendations regarding the amended conditions and explained that the way the amended requirement is worded would provide a way to determine whether there was compliance.

Discussion followed concerning right-of-way and other access issues between the AZGFD, the Forest Service and the developer, relative to the community's concerns over access.

Mr. Hanson pointed out that if the Board wants to specify the length of time for construction then the language in Condition Number 3 needs to be clarified to state that all construction needs to be completed within ten years or whatever length of time determined by the Board of Supervisors.

Vice-Chairman English stated that the Board should be concerned with the water issues.

Supervisor Searle said his other concern is the density bonus; that he would like to make a motion to add to Conditions Number 6 that the density bonus be removed. He added that the requirement for ten years in Condition Number 3 is too short a time in this economy.

Supervisor Searle made a motion to adopt Zoning Ordinance 11-13 to approve Docket Z-11-06 that will amend certain zoning district boundaries in the vicinity of Benson, AZ, pursuant to the application of Easter Mountain, LLC, for parcel #124-01-013H from RU-4 to SR-2, subject to certain conditions as recommended by the Planning & Zoning Commission and further recommended amendments by the Board of Supervisors. Vice-Chairman English seconded the motion.

Supervisor Searle then made a motion to amend the original motion to add a Condition Number 6 to remove the conservation district density bonus and still require the 50% open space requirement. Vice-Chairman English seconded the motion. Chairman Call called for the vote and the amendment carried unanimously.

There followed discussion among the Board regarding Condition Number 4.

Mr. Hanson confirmed that the Board wishes to amend Condition Number 4 in such a way that if the developer provides for vehicular access and if the Forest Service does not build the road within a specified period of time, the condition goes away. Mr. Hanson stated that it would take him a few minutes to craft the appropriate language for the Board's motion.

Chairman Call tabled the item for a few minutes. The Board resumed discussion at 1:54 p.m. after Item 13 and after the Call to the Public.

Mr. Hanson then read the suggested language for Condition Number 4 as amended: Prior to approval of the first subdivision plat, the Applicant must demonstrate that either onsite or offsite multi-purpose (vehicular, pedestrian, equestrian, etc.) legal access to adjacent federal lands has been provided. If access is onsite it will be reflected on all future subdivision plats; provided however, if the developer does provide legal access, that the United States Forest Service, AZGFD or some other agency or person, does not improve access for vehicular use within two years after legal access has been provided, then the condition requiring access for vehicular use shall cease.

Chairman Call made a motion to amend the original motion to amend Condition Number 4 as read aloud by Mr. Hanson. Vice-Chairman English seconded the motion. Chairman Call called for the vote and it carried 3-0.

Mr. Hanson recapped that the original motion has been amended: Number 1 is intact, Number 2 is intact, Number 3 is intact except for deleting "the length of time as determined by the Board"; Number 4 as written by staff except for substituting "approval of" instead of "submitted", Number 5 intact and Number 6 added, as moved by Supervisor Searle. The Board concurred this was their understanding.

Chairman Call called for a vote on the original motion as amended and it passed 2-1 (English opposed).

Chairman Call called for the vote and it carried 3-0.
