

**PROCEEDINGS OF THE COCHISE COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS
REGULAR BOARD MEETING HELD ON
TUESDAY, MARCH 13, 2012**

A regular board meeting of the Cochise County Board of Supervisors was held on Tuesday, March 13, 2012 at 10:00 a.m. in the Board of Supervisors' Hearing Room, 1415 Melody Lane, Building G, Bisbee, Arizona. In attendance were Richard Searle, Chairman; Patrick Call, Vice-Chairman; Ann English, Supervisor; Michael Ortega, County Administrator; Britt Hanson, Chief Civil Deputy County Attorney; and Katie Howard, Clerk of the Board.

Chairman Searle called the meeting to order at 10:00 a.m.

Workforce Development

10. Approve Amendment #5 to Title IB Adult, Youth, and Dislocated Worker contract DE111004001 between Cochise County and the Arizona Department of Economic Security for the WIA Service Delivery Area from April 1, 2010 to August 31, 2015.

Vice-Chairman Call made a motion to approve items 1-10 of the Consent Agenda. Supervisor English seconded the motion and it carried unanimously.

PUBLIC HEARINGS

Community Development

11. Approve Docket SUA-11-13A (Noble), an appeal of Planning and Zoning Commission's January 11, 2012 approval of Docket SU-11-13 (Rainbow Solar Facility).

Ms. Beverly Wilson, Senior Planner, presented the item using a PowerPoint presentation (available on the County's website). Ms. Wilson provided background on the project, reviewing for the Board its location and conditions of approval. On January 11, 2012 the Planning and Zoning Commission (PZC) voted to approve the docket on a vote of 3-2. She showed site photos of access road and the Solar Farm along with views from the property and the concept grading and drainage plan. She stated that at the PZC meeting the question arose as to whether the Planning and Zoning Department had sufficient expertise on staff to analyze and make recommendations regarding such a complex plan; she assured the Board that they did with three engineers on staff. Ms. Wilson discussed Section 1716.03 of the Zoning Regulations and related to the Board the pre-permit conditions agreed upon by the applicant. She also reviewed the two letters of support and two protests and showed a map with the location of each. She stated that Mr. Noble came to the January PZC meeting to present concerns; the other party sent a letter protesting the Special Use Permit. She discussed factors in favor of upholding the PZC decision (deny the appeal) and stated there were no factors suggesting that the appeal should be approved. Ms. Wilson then responded to questions from the Board regarding drainage impact on neighboring properties.

Appellant, Mr. Richard Noble talked about the impact of rain that accumulates quickly during monsoons, showed photos of his property, covered with vegetation and trees, which spreads and slows sheet flow from heavy rains (i.e., rains of one inch or more). He explained that the changes proposed include removing grass, trees and all vegetation, covering with grading, compaction and gravel and installing solar panels. He said this destroys absorption properties of the ground surface and will result in more sheet flow. In addition, they have redirected the flow which will all run downhill and redirects two-thirds of water to northwest corner of property to the detention basin which has limited capacity. The vote at the PZC meeting was 3-2, with the understanding that this is going to get worked out between the planning staff and the developer and he will not be a part of that discussion. Mr. Noble asked that the Board send the item back to the PZC to request a new plan. If it solves the problem, he will not object. If it does not solve the problem he wants the right to object.

Consultant, Mr. Joshua Fields, spoke for the project, and recounted the history of the contact between his client and Mr. Noble: multiple conference calls; attempts to explain Arizona rules and regulations and expansion of basin to help to address concerns. He reiterated that the County has three engineers on staff. He concluded that his client has tried to be good neighbors and Mr. Noble's demands are unreasonable.

Mr. David Bohn, Kinetic Engineering spoke in favor of the project.

Chairman Searle opened the public hearing.

Ms. Madeline Carol Riggs objected to the project due to potential impact to her property values and over dust concerns.

No one else wished to address the Board and Chairman Searle closed the public hearing.

Supervisor English asked about the devaluation of the property.

Ms. Wilson said she spoke with Mr. Leiendecker, Assessor, and he said if this is the kind of development we think it is, that we do not know what kind of development it will be. He said he did not know if it would devalue or add value to the property; he gave a neutral answer.

Mr. Fields said the original setback was 50 feet and they agreed to set that back another 250-300 feet; also happy to comply with any dust control measures. They have agreed to the conditions set by the County, or in addressing any concerns that came up. They have also agreed to screening with trees.

Supervisor English commented that it is a process that is required for the Special Use Permit (SUP) that has caused all these fears. It appears that the expectation of residents is that everything is set in place and all plans firm before a SUP hearing is held at PZC. That is not the case. The hearing is the opportunity to express concerns. A SUP process is testing the idea; if the idea is approved, then the blueprint is developed. She thinks the concerns are valid and wants to be sure they are addressed, but also thinks that the Community Development staff can work with the residents on their concerns to resolve.

Mr. Wilson said the concept plan has not changed and the department has tried to mitigate concerns and come to agreement. Mr. Noble's objections to not being included in future discussions are outside of the process and the site plan has been approved by the PZC.

Supervisor English made a motion to uphold the Planning and Zoning Commission's decision to grant a special use permit in Docket SU-11-13 (Rainbow Solar Facility) and deny Mr. Noble's appeal from that decision. Vice-Chairman Call seconded the motion.

Mr. Britt Hanson, Attorney, said that in an SUP appeal, the motion has to have specific reason(s) for upholding or denying.

Supervisor English revised her motion: For the reasons set forth in the staff report, I move to uphold the Planning and Zoning Commission's decision to grant a special use permit in Docket SU-11-13 (Rainbow Solar Facility) and deny Mr. Noble's appeal from that decision. Vice-Chairman Call seconded the amended motion.

Chairman Searle called for the vote and it carried 3-0.

12. Adopt Resolution 12-05 to approve Docket R-11-08, revisions to the County Planning and Zoning Commission Ordinance.

Vice-Chairman Call made a motion to adopt Resolution 12-05 to approve Docket R-11-08, revisions to the County Planning and Zoning Commission Ordinance. Supervisor English seconded the motion.

Mr. Michael Turisk, Planning Division Manager, presented the item using a PowerPoint presentation (available on the County's website). Mr. Turisk stated that these are amendments to the Ordinance that was established in 1969. He summarized the changes detailed in the PowerPoint.

Mr. Jim Lynch, Chairman of the Planning and Zoning Commission was present to respond to any questions. He said the Ordinance had fallen behind current practices and needed to be updated. The commission spent three meetings discussing current changes; their vote was 7-0 (all commissioners on the commission at the time) and are recommending the Board approve.

The Board thanked Mr. Lynch and the other commission members.

Chairman Searle opened the public hearing. No one wished to address the Board and Chairman Searle closed the public hearing.

Chairman Searle called for the vote and it carried 3-0.

Chairman Searle asked if there were any additional bids and there were none.

Chairman Searle called for the vote and it carried 3-0.

14. [ITEM TABLED FROM FEBRUARY 14, 2012 MEETING]: Adopt Resolution 12-01 to approve a revised Cochise County Human Resources Policy Manual set forth in Exhibit A, rescind previously adopted Human Resources Policies listed in Exhibit B, and approve amendments to the Cochise County Merit System Rules thereby amending the policies listed in Exhibit C; all changes to be effective April 1, 2012.

Vice-Chairman Call made a motion to remove this item from the table. Supervisor English seconded the motion and it passed unanimously.

Supervisor English made a motion to adopt Resolution 12-01 to approve a revised Cochise County Human Resources Policy Manual set forth in Exhibit A, rescind previously adopted Human Resources Policies listed in Exhibit B, and approve amendments to the Cochise County Merit System Rules thereby amending the policies listed in Exhibit C; all changes to be effective April 1, 2012. Vice-Chairman Call seconded the motion.

Mr. Michael Ortega, County Administrator presented this item. Mr. Ortega reviewed the chronology of development of the HR policies reminding the Board that at the meeting on February 14, 2012, the Board heard comments from elected officials and tabled the item to a Work Session which was held on February 28, 2012. Following that discussion, opt out language was developed for elected officials and incorporated into the policy manual. He reviewed other suggested changes; read the language added; and described other changes made. The revised policies were re-sent to elected offices and only one response was received stating that the language was accurate.

Vice-Chairman Call commented that it was a long process and there were many meetings to ensure appropriate vetting.

Mr. Ortega thanked the HR staff and Ms. Howard for their efforts on this project.

Chairman Searle called for the vote and it carried 3-0.

Procurement

15. Approve the award of Invitation for Bids (IFB) No. 12-16-HFM-04 to Empire Machinery Company for one Caterpillar Model 938H High Lift Wheel Loader in the amount of \$189,081 plus applicable sales tax.

Vice-Chairman Call made a motion to approve the award of Invitation for Bids (IFB) No. 12-16-HFM-04 to Empire Machinery Company for one Caterpillar Model 938H High Lift Wheel Loader in the amount of \$189,081 plus applicable sales tax. Supervisor English seconded the motion.

Mr. Dave Seward, Procurement Director, presented this item. Mr. Seward explained that the solicitation was released as a best-value bid, not necessarily based on the lowest bidder. Empire Machinery was ranked on both the best-value and lowest bidder rankings and the raters were from Procurement, Light Fleet, Heavy Fleet and the Highways and Floodplain Departments.

Chairman Searle called for the vote and it carried 3-0.

STATE & FEDERAL LEGISLATION

Discussion and possible action regarding state and federal legislative matters, including but not limited to the items in the attached agenda.

County Supervisors Association Legislative Policy Committee Agenda for March 9, 2012 (*see attached*).

Mr. Ortega stated that the Board had received a copy of the Legislative Policy Committee Minutes from last week.

Supervisor English reported that one bill went haywire during the amendment process and we are now in the position of having to attempt to defeat a bill that we asked to put in place. She spoke regarding retirement contribution and said we kept our employees harmless and it appears we may now have to repay the money they were not even required to pay.

Mr. Ortega pointed out that he had drafted a couple of letters to send to senators and representatives regarding SB1470 and HB 2887. He also explained the issues with SB1342 regarding having the County conduct flood repairs on private and federal properties.

Vice-Chairman Call followed up with a summary of what will become of the \$132,212 that was left over in the Sierra Vista Sub-watershed Organizing Board for local water conservation and education if the water district is not on the ballot this year. It appears it will not be and therefore the state has deemed the money to be more useful for the entire state for assessors to hire part-time employees to catalog conservation easements.

No action was taken on this agenda item.
