

**PROCEEDINGS OF THE COCHISE COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS
REGULAR BOARD MEETING HELD ON
TUESDAY, AUGUST 28, 2012**

A regular board meeting of the Cochise County Board of Supervisors was held on Tuesday, August 28, 2012 at 10:00 a.m. in the Board of Supervisors' Hearing Room, 1415 Melody Lane, Building G, Bisbee, Arizona. In attendance were Richard Searle, Chairman; Patrick Call, Vice-Chairman; Ann English, Supervisor; Michael Ortega, County Administrator; Jim Vlahovich, Deputy County Administrator; Britt Hanson, Chief Civil Deputy County Attorney; and Katie Howard, Clerk of the Board.

PRESENTATION

Presentation by Ms. Cado Daily and Ms. Tess Jurek, University of Arizona Cooperative Extension Water Wise Youth Program, on their programs and the positive impact in the community. Ms. Daily introduced Tess Jurek, a new addition to the Water Wise Program and explained the type of work performed for the program. Health

37. Correct the effective date of Resolution 12-28 previously adopted by the Board of Supervisors on July 24, 2012 from "July 24, 2012" to "August 23, 2012".

Chairman Searle said Item 1 will be removed from the consent agenda at the request of Mr. Jim Vlahovich, and placed on the September 11 agenda.

Vice-Chairman Call made a motion to approve items 2-37 of the Consent Agenda. Supervisor English seconded the motion and it carried unanimously.

PUBLIC HEARINGS

Board of Supervisors

38. Approve a new liquor license application for a series #13 (domestic winery) liquor license submitted by Mr. Dan C. Pierce for Saeculum Cellars located at 4511 East Robbs Road, Willcox, 85643.

Ms. Katie Howard, Clerk of the Board, presented this item. Ms. Howard said the Sheriff's Office and Planning and Zoning Department have recommended approval and the Environmental Health Division noted that the establishment meets all the requirements set forth by the Arizona Food Code; the Treasurer's Office has noted that all property taxes are current. The applicant has paid the \$100 processing fee; there are no known formal protests and staff is recommending approval.

Chairman Searle asked if a liquor license was required in this instance since wine processing would not be done onsite and there is not even a physical building. The only activity taking place there is growing grapes.

Ms. Howard stated that she had called the Arizona Department Liquor Licenses and Control Office to inquire, because the applicant had been told they needed a license to include "grown in Cochise County" on the label; however, although she left messages last week, the ADLLC had not yet responded.

Chairman Searle opened the public hearing. No one wished to address the Board and Chairman Searle closed the public hearing.

Supervisor English made a motion to approve a new liquor license application for a series #13 (domestic winery) liquor license submitted by Mr. Dan C. Pierce for Saeculum Cellars located at 4511 East Robbs Road, Willcox, 85643. Vice-Chairman Call seconded the motion.

Chairman Searle called for the vote and it carried 3-0.

Community Development

39. Adopt Zoning Ordinance 12-11 to amend a certain Cochise County Comprehensive Plan Designation from Neighborhood Conservation (NC) to Developing (DEV).

Mr. Michael Turisk, Planning Division Manager, Community Development, presented this item using a PowerPoint presentation (*copy available on the County's website*). Mr. Turisk explained that this is a request to change a plan designation for a comprehensive plan amendment from NC to DEV for a 6-acre parcel located north of Mustang Corners. He described how the comprehensive plan is based on 4 growth categories out of which there are 7 plan designations, each with specific zoning district. He showed a map with the location of the subject property and zoning of adjacent and nearby properties. He stated that the subject property is in Growth Area Category B which does allow substantial development, but is not designated as "Developing". Mr. Turisk observed that there is precedent for General Business designation in the area. He showed several maps with the developing and neighborhood conservation designations, GB rezoning, and showed photos with views from all directions. He described public feedback and stated that there were two letters in support and two in protest within the notification area, which is 1,000 feet. He said that the Planning and Zoning Commission voted unanimously to approve the comprehensive plan amendment, but also voted unanimously against the rezoning. Mr. Turisk reviewed the four factors in favor and the four factors against approval. He said that the staff recommendation, based on the factors in favor, is that the Board approve both the Comp Plan amendment and the rezoning.

Supervisor English asked about the standard conditions. Mr. Turisk stated that this has to do with the land use change and clears the county if the value of the property decline.

Mr. Bill Martin, Trustee of the retirement plan which owns the parcel, explained that the retirement trust is restricted from developing the property. He stated that the trust has owned the property for 15 years and has been restricted from marketing as GB and added that it has been difficult to market under NC. Mr. Martin discussed the 2008 Comp Plan change and hearings, but stated that issues involving rezoning were not resolved then. His contention is to attract businesses by rezoning to encourage business growth. He reviewed marketing conditions and said there is no retail or office development in the area.

Chairman Searle opened the public hearing. No one wished to address the Board and Chairman Searle closed the public hearing.

Chairman Searle confirmed that the property directly to the north is zoned GB.

Supervisor English asked if approving this rezoning would be helpful to future businesses who wanted to operate in that area.

Mr. Turisk stated that approving the rezoning would help new business skip past the rezoning process. He also informed the Board that GB uses were intended to be low impact to neighboring parcels.

Vice-Chairman Call made a motion to adopt Zoning Ordinance 12-11 to amend a certain Cochise County Comprehensive Plan Designation from Neighborhood Conservation (NC) to Developing (DEV). Supervisor English seconded the motion.

Chairman Searle called for the vote and it carried 3-0.

40. Adopt Zoning Ordinance 12-12 to approve Docket Z-12-05 rezoning Parcel 106-19-018 from Transitional-Residential (TR-36) to General Business (GB), pursuant to the application of Mr. William Martin.

Mr. Michael Turisk, Planning Division Manager, Community Development, had nothing to add from his presentation on the related, previous item.

Chairman Searle opened the public hearing. No one wished to address the Board and Chairman Searle closed the public hearing.

Chairman Searle pointed out that the Planning & Zoning Commission unanimously recommended denial and that staff recommended approval and Mr. Martin, parcel representative, requested approval.

Supervisor English commented that GB only permits uses that are compatible with neighborhood uses.

Chairman Searle stated that he was not opposed to the rezoning.

Supervisor English made a motion to adopt Zoning Ordinance 12-12 to approve Docket Z-12-05 rezoning Parcel 106-19-018 from Transitional-Residential (TR-36) to General Business (GB), pursuant to the application of Mr. William Martin. Vice-Chairman Call seconded the motion.

Chairman Searle called for the vote; approved 3-0.

ACTION

Community Development

41. Approve Intergovernmental Agreement 11-121 amendment 1 between the State of Arizona and Cochise County for the Davis Road Design Concept Report.

Vice-Chairman Call made a motion to approve Intergovernmental Agreement 11-121 amendment 1 between the State of Arizona and Cochise County for the Davis Road Design Concept Report. Supervisor English seconded the motion.

Ms. Karen Lamberton, Transportation Planner, Community Development presented this item using a PowerPoint presentation. Ms. Lamberton said this was a request for a change to an Intergovernmental Agreement (IGA) approved by the Board over a year ago. She stated that the area being worked on was a 24 mile corridor on Davis Road from Hwy 80 to 191. Staff negotiated the addition of a full Environmental Overview for Davis Road and a complete 100% design for build. She explained the mechanics of these agreements and added that the County will not have to pay any additional funds. She added that the Arizona Department of Transportation (ADOT) also provided the County with the software for direct access to ADOT financial records so the County could keep up with the fees. Ms. Lamberton explained that there were two action items related to these IGAs.

Vice-Chairman Call made a motion to approve Intergovernmental Agreement 11-121 amendment 1 between the State of Arizona and Cochise County for the Davis Road Design Concept Report. Supervisor English seconded the motion.

Chairman Searle called for the vote and it carried 3-0.

42. Approve Intergovernmental Agreement 12-081 between the State of Arizona and Cochise County for the Davis Road Project Assessment.

Ms. Karen Lamberton, Transportation Planner, Community Development had nothing to add to her previous related presentation.

Supervisor English made a motion to approve Intergovernmental Agreement 12-081 between the State of Arizona and Cochise County for the Davis Road Project Assessment. Vice-Chairman Call seconded the motion.

Chairman Searle called for the vote; approved 3-0.

County Sheriff

43. Approve the Federal Fiscal Year Operations Stone Garden program award-reallocation grant, Agreement Number 777404-07 (for equipment), for the period from August 1, 2012 through November 30, 2012 in the amount of \$243,872.75.

Vice-Chairman Call made a motion to approve the Federal Fiscal Year Operations Stone Garden program award-reallocation grant, Agreement Number 777404-07 (for equipment), for the period from August 1, 2012 through November 30, 2012 in the amount of \$243,872.75. Supervisor English seconded the motion.

Commander Marc Denney was present to respond to any questions. Supervisor English asked whether the equipment was all new or if some of it was replacing old equipment. Commander Denney explained that some equipment is replacement (37 vehicles) and the remainder of the equipment is new equipment, which follows the requirements for Stone Garden grants.

Chairman Searle called for the vote and it carried 3-0.

Elections & Special Districts

44. Adopt Resolution 12-57 canceling the Sunnyside Fire District Board November 6, 2012 election for the three 4-year board seats up for election and resolving that the board positions are hereby declared vacant, effective the 1st day of December 2012, and appointing Thomas W. Schelling as the administrator, effective December 1, 2012.

Ms. Juanita Murray, Elections & Special Districts Director presented this item explaining that Sunnyside had a 3-member board and Mr. Schelling is the Administrator. Unfortunately the Board members did not get their filings in by the deadline, so the request is to appoint Mr. Schelling, so that he can in turn appoint the board members, after December 1, 2012.

Supervisor English made a motion to adopt Resolution 12-57 canceling the Sunnyside Fire District Board November 6, 2012 election for the three 4-year board seats up for election and resolving that the board positions are hereby declared vacant, effective the 1st day of December 2012, and appointing Thomas W. Schelling as the administrator, effective December 1, 2012. Vice-Chairman Call seconded the motion.

Chairman Searle called for the vote; approved 3-0.

45. Adopt Resolution 12-71 canceling the Babocomari Fire District Board November 6, 2012 election for the three 4-year board seats up for election; resolving that that board positions are hereby declared vacant; and appointing Thomas W. Schelling as the administrator, effective the 1st day of December 2012.

Ms. Juanita Murray, Elections & Special Districts Director presented this item. Ms. Murray explained that Mr. Schelling has served as administrator for that district and that no one has come forward to file for a seat on the board, nor have they for many years.

Supervisor English asked if the Board could dissolve a district if the community no longer supports it.

Mr. Hanson said he would find out what the dissolution process was.

Vice-Chairman Call made a motion to adopt Resolution 12-71 canceling the Babocomari Fire District Board November 6, 2012 election for the three 4-year board seats up for election; resolving that that board positions are hereby declared vacant; and appointing Thomas W. Schelling as the administrator, effective the 1st day of December 2012. Supervisor English seconded the motion.

Chairman Searle called for the vote; approved 3-0.

46. Adopt Resolution 12-72 canceling the Naco Fire District Board November 6, 2012 election for the three 4-year board seats up for election and resolving that the board positions are hereby declared vacant, effective the 1st day of December 2012; and appointing Joe X. Garcia as the Administrator to administer the district with the same duties and obligations of the elected board.

Ms. Juanita Murray, Elections & Special Districts Director presented this item. Ms. Murray explained that ARS 38-804(d) changed last year, which does away with the option of a Fire Chief and Secretary to operate a district. She stated that there was not enough time to secure boards for this district or San Simon after the legislative change was made and before the election but that there are 2 or 3 people in that district who are willing to serve. She said the thought is that Mr. Garcia, who has served as secretary to the district for many years, would be appointed and then, in turn, appoint the board members.

Supervisor English made a motion to adopt Resolution 12-72 canceling the Naco Fire District Board November 6, 2012 election for the three 4-year board seats up for election and resolving that the board positions are hereby declared vacant, effective the 1st day of December 2012; and appointing Joe X. Garcia as the Administrator to

administer the district with the same duties and obligations of the elected board. Vice-Chairman Call seconded the motion.

Chairman Searle called for the vote; approved 3-0.

47. Adopt Resolution 12-73 canceling the San Simon Fire District Board November 6, 2012 election for the three 4-year board seats up for election and resolving that the board positions are hereby declared vacant, effective the 1st day of December 2012; and, appointing Heather G. Lentz to administer the district with the same duties and obligations of the elected board.

Ms. Juanita Murray, Elections & Special Districts Director presented this item. Ms. Murray said this item was also on the agenda because of the change in the law. She stated that the Fire Chief recommended Heather Lentz who is a firefighter for the district.

Supervisor English stated that there was not time after the change in legislation to establish a new board before this election.

Vice-Chairman Call made a motion to adopt Resolution 12-73 canceling the San Simon Fire District Board November 6, 2012 election for the three 4-year board seats up for election and resolving that the board positions are hereby declared vacant, effective the 1st day of December 2012; and, appointing Heather G. Lentz to administer the district with the same duties and obligations of the elected board. Supervisor English seconded the motion.

Chairman Searle called for the vote; approved 3-0.

The representatives from Sunwize stated that they looked forward to a long-term partnership with Cochise County

Mr. Hanson stated that the County will not own the solar facilities but will purchase electricity at a fixed rate for the next 20 years then will have the option at the end of the term to purchase the solar facilities. The representative from SunWize explained that performance incentives that they are applying for this week requires that the applicant (SunWize) be the owner of the facility in order to get the tax credits.
