

**PROCEEDINGS OF THE COCHISE COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS  
REGULAR BOARD MEETING HELD ON  
TUESDAY, OCTOBER 22, 2013**

A regular board meeting of the Cochise County Board of Supervisors was held on Tuesday, October 22, 2013 at 10:00 a.m. in the Board of Supervisors' Hearing Room, 1415 Melody Lane, Building G, Bisbee, Arizona. In attendance were Ann English, Chairman; Richard Searle, Vice-Chairman; Patrick Call, Supervisor; Mike Ortega, County Administrator; Jim Vlahovich, Deputy County Administrator, Elda Orduno, Civil Deputy County Attorney; and Arlethe Rios, Clerk of the Board.

Chairman English called the meeting to order at 10:16 a.m.

**ROLL CALL** – All three supervisors present.

**CALL TO THE PUBLIC**

Chairman English opened the Call to the Public.

Mr. Jack Cook addressed the Board on matters of personal concern.

No one else chose to speak and Chairman English closed the Call to the Public.

**CONSENT**

**Board of Supervisors**

1. Approve the Minutes of the regular meeting of the Board of Supervisors of October 8, 2013.
2. Adopt Resolution 13-33 in accordance with A.R.S. 48-901 et. seq., approving the establishment of the San Pedro Domestic Water Improvement District as described in the attached Petition, including Exhibits A-F and appointing Dr. Mark Kartchner, Ms. Marion Kartchner, and Mr. Kevin Keith Kartchner to serve as the initial governing board.
3. Approve an application for a temporary Extension of Premises liquor license submitted by Mr. David C. Braun for TJs Bar & Grill located on 135 Frontage Road in Pearce.

4. Approve an Intergovernmental Agreement (IGA) for the County Attorney to represent the Industrial Development Authority in its dissolution.

6. Approve an award of contract to Wendell M Hughes for Indigent Defense Contract Services pursuant to Request for Qualifications (RFQ) No. 14-03-IDC-01 for the period of October 22, 2013 through June 30, 2014.

Supervisor Call made a motion to approve items 1-6 of the Consent Agenda. Vice-Chairman Searle seconded the motion and it carried unanimously.

### **PUBLIC HEARING**

#### **Board of Supervisors**

7. Approve a person transfer liquor license application for a series #9 (liquor store) liquor license submitted by Ms. Judith L. Leiker for Mustang Mall located at 13116 S. Hwy 191, Pearce, 85625.

Ms. Arlethe Rios, Clerk of the Board presented this item. Ms. Rios said the Sheriff's Office and Planning and Zoning Department have recommended approval and the Environmental Health Division noted that the establishment meets all the requirements set forth by the Arizona Food Code; the Treasurer's Office has noted that all property taxes are current. The applicant has paid the \$100 processing fee; the Board staff recommended approval.

Chairman English opened the public hearing. No one chose to speak and Chairman English closed the public hearing.

Vice-Chairman Searle made a motion to approve a person transfer liquor license application for a series #9 (liquor store) liquor license submitted by Ms. Judith L. Leiker for Mustang Mall located at 13116 S. Hwy 191, Pearce, 85625. Supervisor Call seconded the motion.

Chairman English called for vote and it carried unanimously.

#### **Community Development**

8. Adopt Zoning Ordinance 13-05 to approve Docket R-13-01, adopting the proposed amendments to the Cochise County Zoning Regulations which edit, clarify, simplify, and add new definitions to the Regulations.

Ms. Beverly Wilson, Planning Director presented this item using a PowerPoint Presentation. Ms. Wilson gave the background for this item. She listed the major changes that were made. Stated why changes were made and lists the major changes to regulations.

Chairman English opened the public hearing.

In support were:

Chairman English closed the public hearing.

Vice-Chairman Searle listed his concerns with the changes, specifically: leaving statutes out, definition of temporary shelters in RV parks, fencing for corner lots, limitation of structures on rural properties, definition of non residential use permit, small vehicle maintenance on private property, and construction equipment storage.

Supervisor Call made a motion to Adopt Zoning Ordinance 13-05 to approve Docket R-13-01, adopting the proposed amendments to the Cochise County Zoning Regulations which edit, clarify, simplify, and add new definitions to the Regulations and include the following changes made today:

Definitions, Article 2, Added Arizona Revised Statutes (ARS) with a note to contact the Community Development Department for updates

Definitions, Article 2, Added Non-Residential Use Permit – Commercial Building/Use Permit

Definitions, Article 2, Recreational Vehicle Park, Added sentence to include tents and portable shelters

Article 3, Section 307, Non-Permitted Uses, remove wording that specifically prohibits uses not listed

Article 6, Section 606.01, Other Permitted Uses, Added word "solid" to describe fences  
Article 6, Section 606.03, Other Permitted Uses, Added wording that allows multiple structures in category C & D  
Article 7, Section 706.03, Other Permitted Uses, Added word "solid" to describe fences  
Article 17, Section 1720.03.B, Particular Temporary Uses Permitted, Added the word "Contractor's" to specify who can store construction equipment

Vice-Chairman Searle seconded the motion.

Chairman English called for vote and it carried 3-0.

9. Approve Docket SUA-13-13 (AIRES Appeal), an appeal of a September 11, 2013 Planning Commission decision on a Special Use request.

Mr. Keith Dennis, Planner II, presented this item using a PowerPoint Presentation. Mr. Dennis gave the background information and said that the Planning & Zoning Commission had denied the petition unanimously. He showed pictures of the location, a map, the concept plan, and which neighbors opposed and supported the center. He noted that there was an inspection done by the Fry Fire Department and they found fire/safety violations.

Mr. Marc Langschwager, representative for AIRES the appellant, explained the purpose of the company using a PowerPoint presentation. He formally withdrew the appeal and requested a timeframe to relocate the facility and move out of the area.

Chairman English opened the public hearing.

Mr. Damon H. Drayfahl, neighbor, addressed the Board on behalf of 20 neighborhood petitioners in opposition of the program.

Mr. Howard Meyers, neighbor, was opposed to the program due to several issues that were not addressed by AIRES regarding the well being of its customers.

Ms. Kelley Jones, neighbor, was in support of the program and expressed her disappointment in regards to the program leaving the area.

Ms. Rhonda Mobley, neighbor, was in support of the program and had two sons that currently attended the program.

Chairman English closed the public hearing.

The Board asked Mr. Langschwager questions about the program and the regulations it complies with.

Mr. Langschwager said that although the company has many years of experience with regulations and safety codes it was not as familiar with regulations in rural areas.

The Board asked Ms. Orduno what the appropriate motion should be to disapprove the appeal, but give Mr. Langschwager enough time to move.

Ms. Orduno stated that the Board should move to accept the withdrawal and allow a six month time frame in which AIRES would relocate.

Mr. Dennis noted that a similar case had occurred recently and that in order to give them time to relocate a temporary special use permit would have to be approved. He said that the applicant shall have 30 days to sign an acceptance of condition forms, work with Fry Fire District and the County Building Code staff to coordinate the relocation, and discontinue use of the land for this purpose on or before April 1, 2014. He also stated that in addition the applicant had the responsibility of obtaining additional permits to be in compliance temporarily with County regulations.

Supervisor Call made an amended motion to approve a temporary special use permit for Docket SUA-13-13 (AIRES Appeal), an appeal of a September 11, 2013 Planning Commission decision on a Special Use request, for six months in order to vacate location and give AIRES 30 days to coordinate with County Planning staff and the local fire department to comply with conditions noted by Mr. Dennis. Vice-Chairman Searle seconded the motion.

Chairman English called for vote and it carried 3-0.

## **ACTION**

### **Board of Supervisors**

10. Approve a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) between Cochise County and the City of Douglas for non-exclusive commercial use of the Bisbee-Douglas International Airport for economic development purposes and a period of five years, renewable for successive five-year terms, effective upon full execution of agreement.

Mr. Mike Ortega, County Administrator presented this item. Mr. Ortega said that the framework for agreement was previously discussed at a past work session. He stated that although an understanding was established verbally the MOU made it a formal agreement.

Supervisor Call moved to approve a Memorandum of Understanding between Cochise County and the City of Douglas for non-exclusive commercial use of the Bisbee-Douglas International Airport for economic development purposes and a period of five years, renewable for successive five-year terms, effective upon full execution of agreement. Vice-Chairman Searle seconded the motion.

Vice-Chairman Searle said that he did not agree with a formal agreement as the County was the entity responsible for the airport and any decisions regarding its use should come to the Board first.

Chairman English called for the vote and it carried 2-1 (Searle opposed).

11. Adopt Resolution 13-34 to approve the appointment of a member of the Cochise County Board of Supervisors to the Sierra Vista Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) pursuant to the Joint Project Agreement between the State of Arizona and the City of Sierra Vista as specified by Governor Janice K. Brewer.

Mr. Dan Coxworth, City of Sierra Vista Senior Planner, presented this item. Mr. Coxworth gave the background and said that in order to receive federal funds the City of Sierra Vista had to appoint a member of the County Board of Supervisors to the MPO.

Supervisor Call suggested that Vice-Chairman Searle be appointed to the MPO and that he could be the alternative.

Speakers:

Mr. Douglas Behnke, resident of Sierra Vista addressed the Board on his issues with a Board member being a member of the MPO.

Ms. Jere Fredenburgh, resident of Sierra Vista addressed the Board on the procedures the MPO would be following specifically its lack of policy for public input.

Supervisor Call moved to approve the appointment of a Richard Searle, Cochise County Board of Supervisors to the Sierra Vista Metropolitan Planning Organization pursuant to the Joint Project Agreement between the State of Arizona and the City of Sierra Vista as specified by Governor Janice K. Brewer. Vice-Chairman Searle seconded the motion.

Chairman English called for the vote and it carried 3-0.

### **County Attorney**

12. Abate the personal property taxes and interest owed by taxpayer Richard Fascanella for 2008, 2009, and 2010 on account number 07002701, which total \$7,718.48, pursuant to A.R.S. 42-18124.

Ms. Elda Orduno, County Attorney presented this item. Ms. Orduno gave the background and said this item was previously heard by the Board as the Board of Equalization in September and that the Board requested that the Attorney's Office research the issue and provide a suggestion to the Board on how this could be dealt with. She said that per state statute the Board had the authority to abate the taxes for this property.

Vice-Chairman Searle said that with the tax lien revoked Mr. Fascanella could clean up the property.

Mr. Alain Hartman, attorney for Mr. Fascanella, said that he would ensure that a formal letter from the applicant would be sent to the Board acknowledging that the condition for the taxes to be abated was to clean up the property.

Supervisor Call moved to abate the personal property taxes and interest owed by taxpayer Richard Fascanella for 2008, 2009, and 2010 on account number 07002701, which total \$7,718.48, pursuant to A.R.S. 42-18124 and the

property owner will provide a letter stating that he will remove property within a 90 day period. Vice-Chairman Searle seconded the motion.

Chairman English called for the vote and it carried 3-0.

#### **Information Technologies**

13. Approve an Intergovernmental Agreement (IGA) between City of Sierra Vista & Cochise County for the purchase of Radio System Equipment for Law Enforcement Purposes effective October 22, 2013 to October 21, 2014.

Mr. Tyson Mock, IT Director, presented this item. Mr. Mock gave the background and said that the purpose of this IGA was to ensure the County was reimbursed by the City of Sierra Vista.

Vice-Chairman Searle moved to approve an Intergovernmental Agreement (IGA) between City of Sierra Vista & Cochise County for the purchase of Radio System Equipment for Law Enforcement Purposes effective October 22, 2013 to October 21, 2014. Supervisor Call seconded the motion.

Chairman English called for the vote and it carried 3-0.

#### **Procurement**

14. Approve the revision of Sections 5.2, 6.1, 6.2, 6.2.3, 7.0, 8.1, 8.1.1, 9.8.2.3, and 13.6.1 of the procurement policy to reflect House Bill (HB) 2599, Procurement Reform Law, increasing the informal bid/sealed bid threshold limit from \$50,000 to \$100,000.

Mr. Ortega said that this revision was to ensure compliance with state code.

Supervisor Call moved to approve the revision of Sections 5.2, 6.1, 6.2, 6.2.3, 7.0, 8.1, 8.1.1, 9.8.2.3, and 13.6.1 of the procurement policy to reflect House Bill (HB) 2599, Procurement Reform Law, increasing the informal bid/sealed bid threshold limit from \$50,000 to \$100,000. Vice-Chairman Searle seconded the motion.

Chairman English called for the vote and it carried 3-0.
