H2224: SALE OF FIREWORKS; COUNTIES

Counties are authorized to regulate the sale and use of permissible consumer fireworks in unincorporated areas of the county when a federal or state agency implements state one fire restrictions in any portion of the county. Previously, counties were permitted to regulate the use of fireworks during times when there was a reasonable risk of wildfires in the county.

A person is permitted to use, display or otherwise employ a copy or other resemblance of the county seal only after obtaining approval from the county board of supervisors. The board of supervisors may grant approval to any person showing good cause for a proper purpose, and may adopt rules for the use of the county seal. Knowing violations are a class 3 (mid-level) misdemeanor.

S1116: COUNTY SEAL; BOARD APPROVAL

A person is permitted to use, display or otherwise employ a copy or other resemblance of the county seal only after obtaining approval from the county board of supervisors. The board of supervisors may grant approval on application to any person showing good cause for a proper purpose, and may adopt rules for the use of the county seal. The board of supervisors is required to issue a cease and desist order to any person in violation of these requirements. Failure to comply with the cease and desist order is a class 3 (mid-level) misdemeanor. AS PASSED SENATE.

H2339: FIREARMS; PERMIT HOLDERS; PUBLIC PLACES

It is not misconduct involving weapons by carrying a deadly weapon at a public establishment or event if the person possesses a valid concealed weapons permit. Does not apply to public establishments or events that have security personnel and electronic weapons screening devices and that require each person carrying a deadly weapon to leave it in possession of the security personnel while the person is in the establishment or event. Does not apply to an "educational institution" (defined elsewhere in statute), community colleges, public universities, or the licensed premises of any public establishment with a liquor license. AS PASSED HOUSE.

H2483: FIREARMS; PRIVATE LAND; LAWFUL DISCHARGE

County ordinances are prohibited from preventing, restricting or otherwise regulating the lawful discharge of a firearm or air gun or use of archery equipment on a private lot or parcel of land that is not open to the public on a commercial or membership basis. The otherwise lawful discharge of a firearm or air gun or use of archery equipment cannot be enjoined by the court except under specified circumstances shown by clear and convincing evidence.

H2688: FIREWORKS; PERMISSIBLE USES; FINES

Modifies the definition of "permissible consumer fireworks." Sellers of fireworks that are to be shipped directly out of Arizona or fireworks that are to be used for managing wildlife are required to maintain specified information on the sale for a period of five years and make that information available on request to the State Fire Marshal or Local Fire Marshal. Failure to maintain or make available the information is subject to a fine of \$500 per violation. Establishes fines and penalties for various other violations of fireworks regulations.

S1158: FIREWORKS; PERMISSIBLE USE (TECH CORRECTION; TEXTBOOK PURCHASE)

In counties with a population of more than 500,000 (Pima and Maricopa Counties), incorporated municipalities are authorized to regulate the use and sale of permissible consumer fireworks within the municipal limits and counties are authorized to regulate the use and sale of permissible consumer fireworks within the unincorporated areas of the county at any time, instead of only when there is a reasonable risk of wildfires in the immediate county. The sale of permissible consumer fireworks must be allowed from June 20 through July 5 and from December 14 through January 1 each year, and the use of permissible consumer fireworks must be allowed from June 30 through July 6 and from December 26 through January 2 each year. Modifies the definition of "permissible consumer fireworks." Sellers of fireworks that are to be shipped directly out of Arizona or fireworks that are to be used for managing wildlife are required to maintain specified information on the sale for a period of five years and make that information available on request to the State Fire Marshal or Local Fire Marshal. Failure to maintain or make available the information is subject to a fine of \$500 per violation. Establishes fines and penalties for various other violations of fireworks regulations. AS PASSED SENATE.

S1483: COUNTY SUPERVISORS; POPULATION THRESHOLD; MEMBERSHIP

Any county having a population of at least 150,000 but not more than 175,000 persons and having a county board of supervisors that consists of three persons is required to submit to the electors of the county, at the next general election following the decennial census, the question of whether the county will elect five members to the board. If the voters approve, the board of supervisors is required to redistrict the county pursuant to statute. At the next general election immediately following the approval, the county must elect five members who are qualified electors of their supervisorial district. The elected supervisors will hold office for a term of four years, beginning on January 1 immediately following their election. Session law specifies that until the results of the 2020 U.S. decennial census are released, the board of supervisors of any county that reaches a population of at least 150,000 but not more than 175,000 persons, as determined by the annual population estimate provided by the Office of Employment and Population Statistics, is required to submit to the electors of the county, at the next general election, the question of whether the county will elect five members to the board. If the voters approve, the board of supervisors is required to redistrict the county pursuant to statute. At the next general election immediately following the approval, the county must elect five members who are qualified electors of their supervisorial district. The elected supervisors will hold office for a term of four years, beginning on January 1 immediately following their election. AS PASSED SENATE.

Statute governing proceedings subsequent to the appointment of a guardian for an incapacitated person is repealed and replaced. The court at the place where the ward resides for a period of at least two years must assume jurisdiction from the court that appointed the guardian, instead of the two courts having concurrent jurisdiction. Establishes procedures the courts must follow if the court located at the place where the ward resides is not the court in which acceptance of appointment is filed. AS PASSED HOUSE.

S1415: MUNICIPAL ELECTIONS; MAJORITY VOTE CALCULATION

Establishes a formula for determining the majority of votes cast in municipal elections for the office of mayor or city council. If more candidates receive a majority of votes cast than there are seats to be filled for that office, the candidates who receive the highest number of votes shall be declared elected to that office. If no candidates or not enough candidates receive the majority of votes cast, the number of candidates who advance to the general or runoff election must be equal to twice the number of seats to be filled.
